We help students identify their strengths, develop job skills, explore career paths, and achieve professional goals. Our personalized approach aims to connect students' potential with workforce opportunities.

Our Services for Students with Disabilities

Lincoln Square Coaching assists families with accessing Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS) for eligible students with disabilities in New Jersey. We guide families students through the required DVRS referral process, including:

- Identifying eligible students (ages 14-21 with documented disabilities)
- Gathering necessary documentation
- Submitting proper referrals to New Jersey DVRS
- Obtaining required authorizations before service delivery

Important: All students must be referred to NJ DVRS before receiving Pre-ETS services. This referral process is not a full application to DVRS but ensures students can access valuable Pre-ETS services through proper channels. *All services are provided at no cost to students or families.*

Once DVRS provides authorization, we collaborate with students and families to select appropriate Pre-ETS services tailored to individual needs and goals. Our student-centered approach emphasizes informed decision-making and active participation in the transition planning process. Services provided by Lincoln Square Coaching include:

- **Post-Secondary Counseling** helps students plan their post-high school education, choose suitable programs, and understand accommodations.
- **Job Exploration Counseling** assists students in exploring careers, understanding their abilities, and identifying job opportunities.
- **Instruction in Self-Advocacy** trains students to understand their rights, communicate their needs, and advocate for themselves.
- **Workplace Readiness Training** supports students in developing the social and independent living skills needed for workplace success.



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
